The Talk about Laminitis (TAL) initiative was launched in 2012 to raise awareness of the previously under-recognised hormonal causes of laminitis. If your horse or pony is prone to laminitis it's important to know that although grass can be a trigger, up to 90% of laminitis cases are caused by an underlying hormonal disease. One of them, PPID (previously known as Equine Cushing's disease), is a major culprit in horses and ponies of 15 years of age and over. Since 2012, the Talk About Laminitis campaign has provided free* PPID blood tests for over 47,000 horses and ponies in the UK which has helped vets and horse owners to rule PPID in or out of individual laminitis cases. Voucher codes for the free* ACTH tests for new cases will be available at www.talkaboutlaminitis.co.uk from 1st June until 31st October 2017. **So act on your suspicions and talk to your vet about testing today.**

* Laboratory test is free with a voucher for newly tested cases or cases that have previously been sampled and shown as being negative for PPID. Tests are run in batches on a Tuesday and Friday. A normal visit fee and sampling fee will apply – save money on your visit fee by booking on one of our half-price visit fee 'zone' days.

Laminitis – A case a day in May!

While we're "Talking about Laminitis" please don't forget that we're right in the middle of the highest risk period for this horrible condition. Paton and Lee saw an average of one case every day this May! If your horse or pony has come out of the winter in condition score 3 or over, please take care to reduce the feed you give them as the calories they consume from the growing grass increases. With all the rain we've had in recent days, the grass is growing like crazy! You should be able to easily feel your horse's ribs and see them rippling as your horse moves.

Autologous Conditioned Serum (ACS)



As we continue to develop and offer new services for our clients, the practice is delighted to announce that we can now offer in-house autologous conditioned serum (ACS) treatments to help with certain lameness issues. ACS is a biological treatment commonly used in regenerative medicine. Its main indication is in the treatment of osteoarthritis, particularly in joints that have failed to respond to steroid injections.

The protocol for ACS production involves taking blood from your horse, which is then processed to produce a 'soup' of anti-inflammatory proteins (cytokines) that can then be directly injected back into the affected joint of the horse.
